Friends of Sabeel Conference Theme to "Pursue Justice -- Seek Peace"

 The Middle East Working Group (MEWG) of the Metro D.C. Synod is co-sponsoring the [Friends of Sabeel \(FOSNA\) Conference](#) happening October 1-3 at [Shiloh Baptist Church](#) in NW D.C. Links between the African-American civil rights movement with the Palestinian struggle for rights and self-determination will be highlighted through lecture, drama and discussion. MEWG member Nathan Rich encourages attendance at "this ground-breaking event." Presenters include Dr. Richard Falk, UN Special Rapporteur on Human Rights in the Palestinian Plenary Territories; Dr. Rosemary R. Ruether, theologian and scholar, visiting Professor of Feminist Theology at Claremont School of Theology and Claremont Graduate University; the Rev. Naim Ateek, President and Director of the Sabeel Ecumenical Liberation Theology Center, Jerusalem; and Najla Said, playwright of *Palestine*. 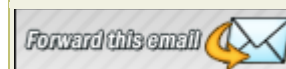
