





FIRST LESSON, Acts 1:1-11

[Luke writes:] ¹In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning ²until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. ⁴While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; ⁵for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

⁶So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." ⁹When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."


SECOND LESSON, Ephesians 1:15-23

GOSPEL

Extinguishing of the Paschal Candle

"Alleluia! Sing to Jesus" ELW #392, Stanza 2 (see page 10)

The flame of the Paschal Candle has burned brightly near the altar at every service since the Easter Vigil, reminding us of Jesus' bodily presence with His disciples during the forty days following His Resurrection. Today, we celebrate Jesus ascending to the right hand of the Father, disappearing from their sight as He was carried into heaven. After hearing the story from Scripture, the flame is therefore removed from our sight as the candle is extinguished, even as we remember His promise, "I am with you always." During the remainder of the year, the candle is lit for baptisms and memorials to remind us of our connection with Jesus Resurrection both upon our entering and departing the earthly Church. Alleluia!

GOSPEL FOR THE SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, John 17:6-19

[Jesus prayed:] ⁶"I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. ⁷Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; ⁸ for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. ⁹I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. ¹⁰All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. ¹¹And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. ¹²While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. ¹⁴I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁵I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. ¹⁶They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth."





ABOUT THE COVER,

Pictured is the Ascension Window, which, as you enter the church, is the last window on the right, above the pulpit. Illustrating the Gospel of St. Mark, the side windows of the nave tell the gospel story beginning at the back right of the church and moving forward, then continuing on the opposite side with one continuous scene of the return of Christ in glory at the end of time.

The Ascension Window pictures Christ being ushered into heaven, up to the right hand of the Father, who is portrayed as a sage old man with a beard, one artist's rendition but an image that might be contested by artists and theologians today. Angels, which have a prominent role in Mark's Gospel, attend our Lord, four encircling him and two flanking the Father, presenting Jesus a crown and scepter. These are symbols of Christ's kingship, replacing the crown of thorns, and authority over all things, replacing the reed with which he was mocked. Christ is still clothed in a scarlet cloak, which symbolizes his humanity, the flesh and blood of his human birth, and the nail prints are clearly visible in his hands.

Ascension Day, which was actually this past Thursday, is the 40th day of the Easter season. Next Sunday is the 50th and final day of the Great Fifty Days of Easter, the Day of Pentecost, when we celebrate the descent of the promised Holy Spirit in wind and fire, signs and great power, the birth of the Christian Church.

Today is also the Seventh Sunday of Easter, the Gospel of which is from Christ's "High Priestly Prayer," which he prayed after the Last Supper, just before his arrest in the garden. This is a prayer for his disciples, really for us His Church, in the world, which He was about to leave. So there is great comfort for us as He sends us out into the world while promising His presence, "I am with you always." C. A. Michaelsen
