Though it might seem that a background in social work or a related field is required for this job, that isn't the case A person over 18 who has a willingness to help others can receive the necessary training from an experienced volunteer to be effective in this important position. Another opening exists on our Grant Writing Team. ECHO needs someone to research grant opportunities, write proposals, and work with ECHO's Finance Team to identify programs that could benefit from grant funding. Unlike most other volunteer positions, it would not require a commitment to a regular work shift at our building.

Housewares has openings for volunteers on Thursday evenings, Monday mornings, and one Saturday morning a month.
